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
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



### **State boards**

AZ	<u>Corporate Commission (three seats)</u> : Democrats could grab a majority on this body, which regulates state utilities, if they sweep all three seats on the ballot.
NH	Executive council (five seats): This unusual body has powers like confirming state judges and other appointments. The GOP currently has a 4-1 edge.
NE	Board of education (Districts 1–4): While these races are nonpartisan, board members differ on issues such as charter schools and trans rights. Earlier this year, for instance, the board voted 5-to-3 against adopting a book-banning policy; four seats are up this year, all held by members who sided with the majority in that decision.




